

	<b>Activity</b>	<b>Guidance for Parents</b>
<b>1</b>	 <p>Do you remember who Avocado Baby chased away in the middle of the night? A burglar. This week's story is called <b>Burglar Bill</b>.</p> <p><a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=RkxUrazqyHA">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=RkxUrazqyHA</a></p> <p>Think of some wow words (adjectives) to describe Burglar Bill. Create a Wanted poster using some of your words, describing what he looks like, maybe offer a reward for his capture.</p>	<p>Perhaps show your child an example of a Wanted poster online or draw template for your child to use as a guide.</p>
<b>2</b>	<p><b>Letter Writing</b></p> <p>Do you remember the structure of a letter? In the story, Burglar Bill decides to lead a honest life and wants to say sorry to the people he stole from. Pretend to be Burglar Bill and write a letter to somebody that he stole something from. What did he steal? How is he going to make things better?</p>	<p>The children have been taught that a letter must have the following - address, date, who it's to, the message and who it's from.</p>
<b>3</b>	<p><b>SWAG</b></p> <p>Find some objects in your home that Burglar Bill might steal. Can you describe them for someone to guess what they are? What words can you use?</p>	<p>Encourage your child to use as many descriptive words as they can without saying the name of the object.</p>
<b>4</b>	<p><b>Burglar Bill word search</b></p> <p>How quickly can you find all the words?</p>	<p>Remind your child that the words can be written horizontally, downwards or diagonally.</p>
