



EYFS Phonics/Reading Activities

Date: 08.06.20 Focus: Guided Reading-We're going on a Bear Hunt Phonics-

All of these activities will be taught in school-phonics on both days they are in and Guided Reading on both days they are in. If you are continuing to home school your child 😊 then you can do all 4 activities at home.

Lesson	Activity	Guidance for Parents
1	<p>Guided reading- This will follow the same format every week and it is one the children are familiar with.</p> <p>There is a copy of <i>We're going on a bear hunt</i> attached. You are going to read this with a grown up.</p> <p>This book has been picked this week because we are doing pattern in maths and there are quite a few repeated words in this story.</p> <p>If you have a copy of the book at home, you can share this with your grown up instead.</p>	<p>*Read the title with your child, ask them what they think the story might be about. I am sure most of the children are very familiar with this story!</p> <p>*The children love 'Echo' reading. You read a line to them and they copy you. They really enjoy it when you use funny voices.</p> <p>*Can they tell you why they might be going on a Bear hunt?</p>
2	<p>Guided Reading</p> <p>Share the story with your grown up again. Can you remember any of the story?</p>	<p>Questions that you can ask your child about the story.</p> <p>*What word is used to describe the day?</p> <p>*What words describe the sound of the mud as they go through it?</p> <p>*What is your favourite part of the story?</p> <p>*How do you think the bear feels at the end of the story?</p> <p>*If you went on an adventure what animal would you like to find?</p>
3	<p>We are introducing the blends fl, gl, pl, cl.</p> <p>Let's look at the pictures, can you work out the word and which blend it uses?</p> <p>Not all of them have the blends we are learning this week - can you spot these ones?</p> <p>Can you separate them out into the different blends.</p>	<p>Making flashcards or just writing them on pieces of paper to match up- really helps the children. If you write them, then they can practice them as well. Let them talk about the words, what they can see- some are more obvious than others.</p>

<p>4</p>	<p>Let's recap on the blends, can you remember any words we talked about yesterday.</p> <p>Choose 2 pictures- can you say what the word is and then say it is a sentence. e.g <u>f</u>lag , there is a flag on a pole.</p> <p>Can you write down the blends and the words. You could write this on a whiteboard, blackboard or if you can print off the sheet and use this.</p>	<p>Encourage your child to recap on the blends, give praise for what they can remember. If they like to play games, make a snap or memory game.</p> <p>It would be good to practice writing them- using a pencil, whiteboard- what ever they like to use. There is a worksheet you can use—but choose what your child prefers to best 😊</p>

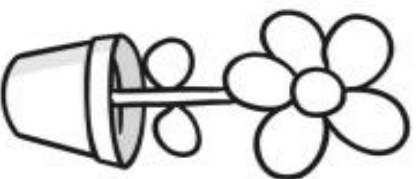
