This is not taught as a separate subject that is taught explicitly but an aspect of learning that should be present in lessons and behaviour in school.

The school's work to promote pupils' personal development and welfare is outstanding.

The school promotes pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development effectively. Pupils are taught about British values such as tolerance and respect through relevant class and assembly themes. Pupils also learn about democracy through activities such the elections to the school council.

Spiritual

Explore beliefs and experience; respect faiths, feelings and values; enjoy learning about oneself, others and the surrounding world; use imagination and creativity; reflect.

Moral

Recognise right and wrong; respect the law; understand consequences; investigate moral and ethical issues; offer reasoned views.

Social

Use a range of social skills; participate in the local community; appreciate diverse viewpoints; participate, volunteer and cooperate; resolve conflict; engage with the 'British values' of democracy, the rule of law, liberty, respect and tolerance.

Cultural

Appreciate cultural influences; appreciate the role of Britain's parliamentary system; participate in culture opportunities; understand, accept, respect and celebrate diversity.
