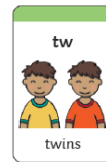
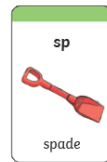
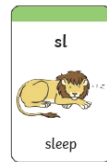


EYFS Phonics/Reading Activities

Date: 22.06.20 **Focus:** Guided Reading-Five Friendly Farmers Phonics- sl,sp,tw,sm

All of these activities will be taught in school-phonics on both days they are in and Guided Reading on both days they are in. If you are continuing to home school your child then you can do all 4 activities at home.

Lesson	Activity	Guidance for Parents
1	<p>Guided reading- This will follow the same format every week and it is one the children are familiar with.</p> <p>The poem Five Friendly Farmers is attached. You are going to read this with a grown up.</p>	<p>*Read the title with your child, ask them what they think the poem might be about.</p> <p>*The children love 'Echo' reading. You read a line to them and they copy you. They really enjoy it when you use funny voices and lots of expression! You can always change it so they could say a couple of lines and you 'echo' your child.</p>
2	<p>Guided Reading</p> <p>Share the poem with your grown up again.</p>	<p>Questions that you can ask your child about the story.</p> <p>*Can you spot the rhyming words?</p> <p>*What do you think the word chores means?</p> <p>*What colour is the evening sky?</p> <p>*Which animal is hungry?</p> <p>*Why do you think the farmers were tired?</p>
3	<p>These are our new blends this week.</p> <p>Can you say the blend?</p> <p>Can you think of other words with the same blends at the beginning?.</p> <p>Have a look around the room, what can you find?</p>	<p>Encourage your child to work out the blend, can they think of other words with the sounds, mix them up with other blends we have been looking at- can they find the new ones?</p>
4	<p>Let's practice matching and writing our blends.</p> <p>If you have a white board and magnetic letters- let's see if you can make the word on the flashcard and then write it underneath. Can you remember the word without the flashcard?</p>	<p>As well as recognising the blends, we are encouraging the children to remember them when writing- which can often be a harder skill to learn. Whatever your child likes doing, so whiteboards, chalk etc- is fine- it is more encouraging them to have a go 😊</p>

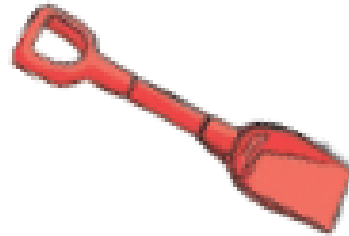


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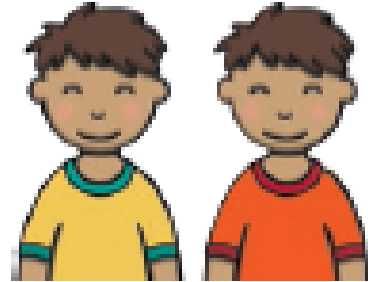
