



Topic Plan

Date: 13.07.20 Focus: Down the farm - crops- wheat, orchard, bees



Lessons 1 and 2 will be taught at school, whatever days your child attends. This means you can work on activities 3 and 4 from home on your 'off' days.

If you are continuing to learn from home, then you can work through the activities in whichever order you wish 😊

Lesson	Activity	Guidance for Parents
1 P.E	On the farm- let's finish our dance with a compilation. Children begin seated on the floor, knees bent and soles of their feet on the floor. Children hold their arms out as if holding onto a big tractor wheel. They bounce on their seat as they turn the tractor wheel for 8 counts. Jump up and pretend to rake the ground for 8 counts. Walk forwards for 4 counts and clap, backwards for 4 counts and clap, walk around in a circle 4 counts, then hands on hips to finish. Yee-haw!!	<i>It is the same music as last week. This is saved on tapestry (6th July)</i> <i>It is a mixture of different movements, listen and count to the beat of the music. If you like country dancing you could teach a few moves!</i>
3 R.E	Feeding of the 5,000. In the bible, which is a Christian's holy book, there is a story about bread. It is a story about a miracle; a very special event where Jesus used a child's lunch to feed 5,000 people. There is a video to watch https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=S6rj9cAJrWE Then have a go at the word search, can you find all the words?	<i>We learn about different religions at school. This story links with our topic and can be discussed with your child. They may need help with the word search as some of the words are backwards in the grid.</i>
1 Science	Experiment. Thinking about food that comes from the farm. Let's have a look at how plants grow. Plants grow from seeds, but are also able to continue growing if they have the right conditions to help them. You just need to use a carrot top, and plant one on a saucer and one in the top of some soil. Think about what you need to do to look after them? (sun, water etc) They should start growing quite quickly. Which carrot will grow the tallest? Can you estimate how tall they will be?	<i>We are thinking about growing and I know you enjoyed growing the sunflowers from transition. There are lots of easy things to grow and you can have a go at using different seeds. I did a bit of research and people have grown apple trees from planting apples seeds, so you never know what you might get!</i>
2 PHSE	Have you thought about where bread comes from? Have a look at the recipe and see what ingredients you need to make bread. You need flour. Where does flour come from? https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=y8vLjPctrclU why not watch this video about how the grain is collected in the field and then ground into flour. You might spot some farm vehicles we talked about last week. Have a look on a packet of flour and see if it tells you what it contains? You could use the recipe to make your own bread rolls!	<i>We are linking with where our food comes from.</i> <i>Children often don't realise where food comes from, other than Tesco! (other supermarkets are available) But it is a good discussion to have about how the food gets there and what is grown in the ground.</i>
