



EYFS Phonics/Reading Activities

Date: 13.07.20 **Focus:** Guided Reading-Rosie's Walk Phonics-Tricky words recap

All of these activities will be taught in school-phonics on both days they are in and Guided Reading on both days they are in. If you are continuing to home school your child then you can do all 4 activities at home.

Lesson	Activity	Guidance for Parents
1	Guided reading- This is different this week. Instead of reading the book, please search for Rosie's Walk by Pat Hutchins on YouTube and enjoy watching it together.	<p>*Your child may have seen and shared this book before. If they haven't tell your child that this is a book that has been made into a cartoon to watch.</p> <p>*Ask your child to look for features of a farm, tractor, pond etc.</p> <p>.</p>
2	<p>Guided Reading</p> <p>Look at the YouTube clip again.</p>	<p>Questions that you can ask your child about the clip.</p> <p>*Can the children spot the prepositions? (Across, around, over, past, through and under).</p> <p>*What do you think the fox is thinking?</p> <p>*What does Rosie go through?</p> <p>*What does Rosie go under?</p> <p>*If you could go for a walk anywhere, where would you go?</p>
3	Recap on our tricky words - Tricky Skittles . If you have skittles, or just some empty plastic bottles. Tape a tricky word onto the skittle- roll a ball at the skittle- you have to say the word you have knocked over	We recap during the last few weeks at school- encouraging them to remember and recognise those tricky words- using different fun activities to encourage them to have a go.
4	Tricky Word Squirty . If you have a water bottle or water gun, why not use this to help remember your tricky words. The words can be written in chalk, you say the word, then squirt the word.	If you don't have the right equipment, just play hide and seek and finding the words can be just as much fun- encouraging them to say the words as they find them.
