THE SCHOOL DAY

In Year 1 there is a more structured timetable covering the core subjects (English, Maths and Science) and foundation subjects (History, Geography, PSHE, RE, Computing, Art & Design, DT, Music and PE)

A typical day would be...

- Register
- Phonics
- English
- Snack & Playtime (snack is provided by Government)
- Maths
- Lunchtime
- Register
- Guided Reading
- Phonics
- Topic

PE

- Our PE day is **Thursday** and **Friday**
- Children are required to come to school in their PE kit (Black shorts and their coloured House T-Shirt) They should also have a dark pair of jogging bottoms and hoodie as we will be doing PE outside as much as possible depending on weather.
- Children are allowed to wear trainers (Velcro) on PE day.

PE

- No earrings on PE days Essex County Council guidelines state 'school children are no longer allowed to tape up their ears to cover earrings for PE or other sporting activities. This is due to injuries received by several pupils across Essex. Therefore, children will need to be able to independently remove their earrings or they will be unable to take part'
- All long hair should also be tied up. No novelty hairbands.

UNIFORM EXPECTATIONS

- Please ensure all items are named.
- Please remember coats/jackets- we do go out to play even if it is raining!
- Black shoes no trainers except on PE day
- No nail varnish
- Water bottle every day please no juice or flavoured water
- School bookbags only

ASSESSMENT

- Children are assessed in reading at least half termly but it is ongoing. Children are given books that match their phonic knowledge.
- Children should have their books and reading diaries in their book bag everyday. Reading diaries should be signed.
- Termly Assessments in Maths, English and Reading
- Yr1 Phonics Screening
- Children are assessed (set by the Government) as
 - Working Towards the Expected
 Standard
 - Working at the Expected Standard
 - Working at Greater Depth within the Expected Standard

HOMEWORK

- Ideally your child should be reading everyday and not just their school reading books. Children can change their books once they have read them as and when required. However all children will change their reading books on a Friday if they have not done so during the week.

HOMEWORK

Children will also have access to our handwriting scheme

We use the letter-join programme to teach handwriting from EYFS to Year 4.

Children are able to access this at home via a desktop or tablet at https://www.letterjoin.co.uk/log-in.html using the appropriate login.

Children can click on their class name to practice specific handwriting skills related to their year group or 'free play' for a range of skills.

PADLET




Look out for our class curriculum journals, hosted digitally by Padlet!
