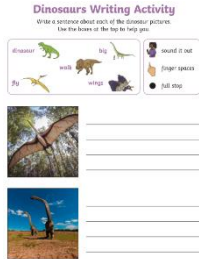

Activity	Activity	Guidance for Parents
<p>1</p> <p>SCHOOL ACTIVITY</p>	<p>Social Distancing Powerpoint. What do the children already know about Coronavirus and Social Distancing? Can they talk about their experience of the 'lockdown' - things they missed but focus more on things they enjoyed.</p> <p>Talk about the word 'bubble' and what it means. Who is in your bubble? Write the names of the children/family members in your bubble. Draw a picture of them.</p> <p>Extension: Write a sentence about something you are grateful for that has happened during lockdown.</p>	<p>Your children can do the same activity as the children in school but with their own bubble at home.</p> <p><i>*Use My Bubble Sheet*</i></p>
<p>2</p> <p>SCHOOL ACTIVITY</p>	<p>Talk about our bubbles from yesterday. Today we are making 'Wish bubbles'! Talk about who else you would like in your bubble. Is there another friend or teacher you would like to add? A family member? Maybe you want to add someone useful - a cleaner, a chef, a hairdresser?</p>	<p>Draw their own 'wish' bubbles - who would they add to their bubble if they could? Can they justify their choices? It can be serious (friends/family) or funny (I might add a chef to mine!!)</p> <p>Cut them out and stick them around your own bubble.</p>
<p>3</p>	<p>Look at the pictures. Who has enjoyed learning about dinosaurs? Can anyone name any? How many do we know? Do you know the names of the dinosaurs on the sheet? We are going to write some sentences about the dinosaurs. What is a sentence? How do we know it is a sentence and not just a label or caption? It has a capital letter and a full stop.</p> <div data-bbox="1189 1158 1386 1417" style="text-align: right;">  </div>	<p>Read the words to your child. Talk about what they mean and help them to write a sentence about the dinosaur. Say the sentence they want to write - count how many words they need to write - capital letter to start - full stop at the end.</p>

4	Dinosaur reading activity - read the word clues. Can you match it up with the correct dinosaur? How do you know it is right? Are any of the clues the same on the different cards?	<p>Read the cards to/with your child. There are some topic words that they will not be able to read. Give these words to your child and then encourage them to read any words that can be sounded out.</p> <p>Once they have matched all the cards with the correct dinosaur talk about any similarities and differences. Can they write their own set of clue cards and draw pictures to match them?</p>
